 Two previous attempts by other researchers (one for a book, and one for a documentary) but didn't bear fruits



### The 70's Syndicate

- Left-wing, anarcho-pacifist group of activist
- Published Biweekly and other publications, made and screen films
- Organised protests and other resistance actions
- Built overseas networks
- Read and discussed
- Getting arrest and being dead cool

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#### Interdisciplinary approach

- Starting from Mok's theatre works and work backward to The 70's Weekly and beyond
- Bring in cultural, intercultural and social studies
- Situate the phenomenon in Hong Kong/China studies

#### Major discovery

- Theatre/art as a means of resistance when radical political actions were not viable (not suppressed, but not effective)
- HK 1970s anarchist movement being the first in the greater China region since the 1920s; but not as a continuation of the Chinese movement, but more akin to the international anti-colonial pacifist movement.
- Importance of critical internationalism in Hong Kong (because of HK's special circumstances)

#### The individual — Mok

- There has been no established discourse about HK to situate him
- From politics to art, but not de-radicalise
- Working within public art administration but anti-(larger)establishment
- Critical both of British colonisation and Chinese Maoism (and after)

The individual as atom

#### A private archive

- Radiating from the individual
- Fields he has acted in
- People and institutions he has connected with
- Ways he has done things (tactics)

 Publications, performance materials, notes, letters, minutes of meeting, police arrest notification, registration procedures etc (by period)
